A posting from the United States Military Academy "West Point" archives was brought to my attention by Warden Bill Bullwinkel, PGK. I would like to share with you the mini-biography of one our most beloved Council members. The Scholarship Aid fund in our Council is named after him. Both Steven and Louise Zellem performed many hours of their time for our Church, Community, and Country. My first memory of this special couple is when Dolores and I attended Mass at the St. Pius X Church. As with many young couples our children were toddlers and a handful. Knowing this, Steven and Louise secured the use of a room in the St. Pius X School to watch and keep them occupied (Drawing Arts/Craft) while the parents could attend Mass in peace. Unselfishly they donated their time so Dolores and I and other young couples could sit at Mass without the usual disturbance cause by young children. Please see the article below and enjoy!

Steven Zellem was bom in Listie, PA, Sept. 21, 1926 to his proud parents, Theodore F. and Bessie Zellem. Steve was the sixth of twelve siblings in a close-knit family. His parents both emigrated from eastern Austria and spoke Russian. They settled in the area of soft coal fields in southwest Pennsylvania. Steve was very sentimental and loved to recall the happy times of his youth. He delighted in recounting the tale of his participation in a conspiracy, when a skunk was mysteriously dropped down the chimney of the one-room schoolhouse, closing it for days.

Steve was the first in his family to attend college. Early on he set his goals to fulfill the American dream. It was shortly after graduating from Somerset Township High School, PA, in 1944, that Steve knew he wanted to serve his fellow man and his country. His path was established when be visited a recruiter and enlisted in the Army Air Corps with the Army of Occupation in Germany. As sure as night follows day, he not only received his first stripe, but applied for and received a regular appointment in the U.S. Army. This appointment fulfilled the requirement for the next step of his ambitious goals, to the Military Academy Preparatory School at Stewart Field in preparation for admission to USMA.

Steve's years at West Point clearly identified him as a man with a mild and unshakable personality, congenial manner, level head, and cool temper. He was always available and ready to give sage advice and assistance. When not struggling with the books, Steve enjoyed extracurricular activities, including the Russian language club and weekends "dragging his One and Only" gal from Brooklyn, Louise. He also spent many hours with the track team as its indispensable team manager.

The day after graduation on 4 June 1952, 2LT Steve Zellem and Louise tied the knot after two years of dating. Steve had recalled, "I'll never forget that blind date in October 1950, when I met the love of my life, Louise Elvira Baratta." She was the second daughter of the prominent Dr. and Mrs. Raphael Baratta of New York City. It was the start of a blissful, loving relationship that endured for a wonderful 51-year marriage. Steve happily recalled introducing city-girl Louise to farm life by informing her that a particular heifer was "fresh." Louise cautiously backed up, fearful of an ill-tempered cow and found herself the center of her warm and loving new family's laughter. They told her the meaning for the word "fresh" was recently pregnant. Steve's first military assignment after marriage was to branch qualification at Ft. Sill, OK. Then he went back to Europe, but this time as a married second lieutenant with the 5th Infantry Division in Germany. Steve's other duty stations were in California and Ft. Carson, CO, before retiring from active duty in 1956.

However, his military career never skipped a beat, for he accepted a Reserve Commission immediately and was assigned to the 77th Infantry Division and its successor, 77th USARCOM. He retired in the rank of colonel from the Army Reserves Sept. 21, 1986. His USAR service included 13 years as commander of an artillery unit in Hempstead, NY. He then commanded the 310th MP Battalion and the 800th MP Group. Prior to his retirement, he was assigned to the Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics. During his reserve duty time, Steve completed Military Police branch qualification, graduated from Command and General Staff College, received the coveted Army War College Diploma, and earned his master's degree in education from Hofstra University. His military decorations included the Meritorious Service Medal in 1979, and the Legion of Merit in 1981.


During his very active reserve career, Steve worked for eight years in private industry before he joined the Commack, Long Island, NY, school district for a very distinguished 20-year career. Steve taught chemistry and served as head of the department. He was also a student mentor. In tribute to Steve, his peers at Commack High School South said, "Steve has always conducted himself in an impeccable, professional manner, yet with understanding and sensitivity to all members of the science department and students alike." Steve was also a pillar of his church, participating in a broad spectrum of church activities, especially the Youth Council, which focused on activities with his two sons. He was an excellent baseball coach, serving also as a fair and respected umpire, who would diffuse any argument with his gentle and logical negotiations. His active participation in the Knights of Columbus prompted that organization to award a tuition-assistance grant to a high school student in Steve Zellem's honor.

Steve shared his deep and active love for God, his country, and his community equally with his devotion to his family. He is survived by Louise, his one and only love, confidante and soulmate throughout life. He is also survived by his two sons. Ralph, a graduate of the St. John's University School of Pharmacy, has served in the Army Medical Service Corps for 20 years. Ron completed his residency in neurosurgery at Temple University and is practicing medicine in central Tennessee. Steve is also survived by daughters-in- law Patricia and Suzanne, and grandchildren Kimberly, Scott, Robert, and Jennifer.

Aside from being an outstanding Army officer with deep Christian values, Steve will always be remembered for his sincerity, integrity, professionalism, and friendship.








Past Grand Knight Ray Ludwig is on a roll and so are those billiards.
