RECOGNIZING JESUS AT THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

The summer is almost here! Bravo!! Alleluia!!! Happy Easter.

The summer is a time for cook out, time to get outdoors, set up the grills outdoors and mount them where it will be accessible and provide avenue for evening relaxations. In the fun and laughter we will share during these moments, we will see the face of Jesus in each other, we will get nourished. It is necessary to remember that after the resurrection, the disciples of Jesus in most cases only recognized him at the breaking of bread. At one point in time, the disciples went back to their former occupation – FISHING – and on coming out of the water, they saw a charcoal fire lit by the shore – BEACH – and it was Jesus. When he asked them for some of the fish they harvested from their labor, Jesus immediately started grilling the fish in the charcoal fire (grill), John 21: 9-13. This passage says: "When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, bring some of the fish you just caught. So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, come, have breakfast. And none of the disciples dared to ask him, Who are you? Because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish."

This summer is a time for evangelization through meals, dinners, grills and stoves in the house. Remember the spiritual significance of food or a meal. During the parish events, all year round the Knights of Columbus do exactly the same at the grills and serving meals. Bravo and alleluia for the Knights of Columbus and the Columbiettes.


is on display with the plaque. The Council's RSVP program was started in his memory.
