

Father Michael J. McGivney's story as told in the "Parish Priest" by Douglas Brinkley and Julie M. Fenster. (Condensed with contributions by the Editor) Part -27 in a series.



With the appointment of an assistant Pastor in Thomaston Parish, Father McGivney had enough free time in 1888 to involve himself in the most significant development within the Knights of Columbus since the order was founded six years before. A group of Catholic men in Providence Rhode Island requested permission to form a Council. It would be the first one outside the State of Connecticut. On July 8th the Tyler Council was initiated in Providence. According to one of the early officers the ceremony was very exciting. Practically nothing happened in the ensuing six months, however. Potential members were awaiting encouragement from the priests, who were awaiting encouragement from the Bishop, Matthew Harkins, who just didn't seem interested in the Knights of Columbus. On that note everything stalled in Providence. At the request of the supreme Knight Father McGivney traveled to Providence, met with the Bishop, and held a public meeting. The results which, was filled to overflowing with interested friends. This proved to be the true launch of "Tyler" Council and there was no turning back.




